RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. NO Mixes.
2. Food will not be displayed at the fair or returned. EXCEPTION: Decorated cakes and cookies will be displayed by photo only.
3. Must include recipe with all food entries in a **disposable container**.
4. All entries must have a 3" x 5" card attached with the following information: Troop #, age, materials used, how and why made. Exhibits cannot exceed 36" x 30" x 24" with the exception of sewing entries which may be folded.
5. All entries are to be brought to Cove Springs Church, 3685 Walnut Grove Rd., (across from the Elizabeth Township Building), Tuesday, August 3, 2010, from 2 to 7 p.m.
6. **To purchase fair passes, girls need to bring \$2 and leaders who have signed entry forms may purchase one for \$20. NO CHECKS! CASH ONLY!**
7. ALL ENTRY FORMS ARE DUE TO THE FAIR OFFICE, NO LATER THAN SATURDAY, JULY 24, 2010 AT 5 p.m.
8. All entries are to be picked up AFTER 6:00 p.m., the closing day of fair. NO EXCEPTIONS!!
9. NO MORE THAN 6 ENTRIES BY GIRL OR TROOP ALLOWED. Limit of six exhibits per troop item entry.
